

## As we are praying and fasting, remember these five things:

FIRST God has given us a pattern for prayer (Matthew 6:9-13; Luke 11:1-4):

- Relationship: Our Father in Heaven
- Worship: Hallowed be Your Name
- Lordship: Your Kingdom come, Your will be done
- Sonship: Give us this day our daily bread and forgive us our debts
- Fellowship: As we forgive our debtors
- Leadership: And do not lead us into temptation, but deliver us from evil
- Ownership: For Yours is the Kingdom and the power and the glory forever

**SECOND** we fast so that we might feast on God and His word. When you are fasting, consume more of God's word than you normally do. Don't just use that time to pray, use it to hear from God's word. This is what will sustain you.

**THIRD** as you are reading, pray the Scriptures. Allow the Word of God to guide your prayers. Stop while you are reading and pray the Word of God.

**FOURTH** listen to what the Spirit of God is saying. Fasting clears our senses so that we might hear more clearly from God.

**FIFTH** pray with anticipation, expectation, and persistence. Great movements of God have always been preceded by great times of prayer (Acts 1-2). We have a big God who wants His people to pray big prayers. Pray with confidence. Ask, seek, and knock (Matthew 7:7-12).

## **Areas of Prayer: For the Church**

#### Life of Worship

- For God to manifest His presence among us (Isaiah 64)
- God would bless the preaching of His word (Ezra 7)
- God would give us a heart of praise (Psalm 138)
- That God's blessing would be on us and our work (Psalm 67)
- God would receive the glory from everything we do (Psalm 115:1)
- That our lives would be a sacrifice of worship (Romans 12)

- God would bless The River on Wednesday evenings and that we would see specific answers to prayer (Ps 61:1)
- For God to provide the resources we need through the sacrificial giving of our people (2 Cor. 9:10-11)

#### Life in Community

- God would unite us to each other (John 17)
- That we would love one another deeply (John 13:34)
- That we would be devoted to one another in brotherly love (Romans 12:10)
- That we would serve one another (Galatians 5:13)
- We would extend grace, compassion, and kindness toward one another (Eph 4:32)
- Each member would be actively engaged in the life and ministry of the church (Hebrews 10:25)
- Pray for those who have wandered away from church and the faith (Matthew 18:15-20)
- We would bear one another's burdens (Galatians 6:1-2)
- Community Groups would develop authentic community (Acts 2:42-47)

#### Life on Mission

- God would manifest His kingdom through seeing people saved (Luke 4:18)
- God would give us His power and authority (Luke 9:1)
- God would give us a heart for the lost (Matthew 9:36)
- God would add to our number daily those who are being saved (Acts 2:47)
- God would give us open doors to share the Gospel (Colossians 4:1-4)
- Pray that we would see people saved through our Beautiful Feet Ministry
- Pray that every member would be making disciples (Matthew 28:18-20)
- Pray for the children in our church to come to know Christ (Luke 18:16)

### **Pray for Protection:**

- God's protection over our families, our church, and our nation (John 17:15)
- God would protect us from sin (Psalm 19:13)
- God would protect us from the enemy (Eph. 6:10-20; James 4:7)
- God would protect us from disunity (John 17; Acts 6)

#### Pray for Revelation:

- A spirit of wisdom and revelation (Eph 1:17)
- Open our eyes to see the truth of His word (Psalm 119:18)
- God would reveal to us His plans and strategies for our church (Ps 25:4)
- For the Lord to reveal His power and glory to us (Ps 77:14)
- God would reveal himself to the lost (Ez 38:23)

#### **Pray for Direction:**

- Clear direction on what God is calling us to do (Prov 3:5-6)
- Lead us in the paths of righteousness (Psalm 23:3)
- Wisdom and direction for every area of ministry (James 1:5)
- The Holy Spirit would guide us into all truth (John 16:13)

- For trust, community and fellowship amongst the committee members (Ps. 133:1)
- Have the mind of Christ and not their own agenda (Phil. 2:5, Isa. 55:9)
- For Word-centered wisdom (Rom. 12:1-2)
- For perseverance in all their tasks and that they would spur each other on (Heb. 10:19-25)
- Be at peace and teach, admonish, and love one another (Col. 3:15-17)
- For unity and agreement (1 Cor. 1:10, Col. 3:14, Rom. 16:17)
